BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT PLANS - 1961

Point 1. Dates and Location

- "B" Tournament will be March 9, 10, 11, 1961, at Bend, Oregon.
- "A-2" Tournament will be March 13, 14, 15, 1961, at Coos Bay, Oregon.
- "A-1" Tournament will be March 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 1961, at Eugene, Oregon.

Point 2. Basis for Team Selection

The state has been divided into 8 A-1 Districts, 8 A-2 Districts, and 8 B Districts. In the A-1 classification, two (2) teams to represent each district. In the A-2 and B classifications one (1) team to represent each district at the State Tournament. Each district committee will determine how the champion of their district will be decided. It is suggested that wherever possible, the district champion be determined on the percentage basis. It will be the duty of the chairman of each district committee to notify the schools in his district regarding the plans of their district not later than January 15. Copy of these plans to be sent to the O.S.A.A. office.

Point 3. Number on Team, Practice, and Expenses

- a. Number on team
Each team competing in the State Tournament may bring 10 players, one manager, a coach, and the school principal.
- b. Practice
No team shall arrive at site of tournament more than 24 hours in advance of its playing time, with the exception of A-1 teams scheduled to practice Monday night, and these teams shall be allowed an extra half day's expense.
- c. Expenses—team
Each team will be allowed 45c per mile one way for transportation by the shortest route. Teams traveling over 500 miles will be given an extra day's expenses. Allowance of \$8.50 per day per man for food and lodging. Teams to be paid through tournament.
The following are exceptions to this general plan:
Home teams to receive no allowance. Teams staying at home and driving to and from the site of Tournament will receive mileage and necessary allowance for meals. The allowance for meals to be determined by the Board of Control.
- d. Special extended benefits for the 1961 tournaments
In addition to team expenses, schools participating in the 1961 basketball tournaments will receive a per game expense benefit. This additional 1961 money is based upon the number of miles traveled to the tournament as well as the number of days the team remains in the tournament.
 1. Schools traveling over 150 miles (one way) will receive \$100 for every day their team remains in the tournament.
 2. Schools traveling between 35 and 150 miles (one way) will receive \$80 for every day their team remains in the tournament.
 3. Schools traveling less than 35 miles (one way) will receive \$40 for every day their team remains in the tournament.

Point 4. District Tournaments

After conferring with the State Board of Health and the State Department of Education, the Board of Control has ruled that in district tournaments, not more than three (3) games in a seven consecutive day period shall be played and all plans are to be approved by the Board.

District champions must be determined at least six (6) days prior to the State Tournament.

District Committees for A-1, A-2, and B schools were published in the September Bulletin.

Point 5. Officials

The District Chairman will be responsible for polling the schools of his district regarding the selection of officials to work the district tournament. The officials are to be determined not later than March 1, and the O.S.A.A. office should be notified. Officials to work the State Tournaments will be selected by a ballot of the schools.

Note: Many districts are voting as a district rather than by individual schools. This, of course, is permissible and perhaps desirable.
